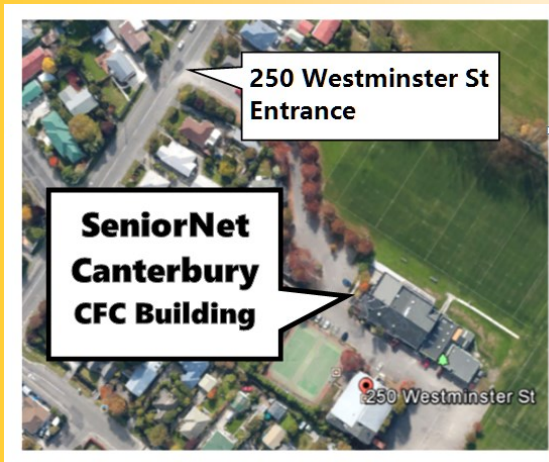


**LOCATION** SeniorNet Canterbury have rooms in the Canterbury Football Club building, 250 Westminster Street, Mairehau

SeniorNet Canterbury has courses and workshops to help members learn and become comfortable with the above technology.

Membership is open to the 50 and above age group.

**SeniorNet** is a non-profit-making organisation offering members peer computer training. Our courses are based on the Microsoft Windows operating system but also have workshops covering Android and iPad tablets.

Our Tutors are all volunteers with extensive experience and are in the same age group as the students. Classes have a maximum of six students with two tutors, reasonable charges are made to cover the Society's running costs.

## COURSES and WORKSHOPS

Offered by SeniorNet Canterbury Inc

The majority of Courses and Workshops are for Microsoft Windows 10 Operating System

### FIRST STEPS:

**Introduction to Computers One** - Four 2-hour sessions - covering the basic operation and safe use of computers and the Microsoft Windows Operating system. Suitable for complete beginners or members wishing to refresh.

### Introduction to Computers Two -

Four 2-hour sessions, based on Microsoft Word 2007/2010/2013 program. Learn to create and save documents; understand the basics of the computer filing system. Includes inserting Clip Art, Word Art and pictures.

**File Management Part 1** - Two 2-hour sessions. This course introduces members to the computer file and folder filing system. An understanding of file arrangement will help avoid many of the frustrations when saving and re-locating files. Must be followed up with **File Management Part 2**.

**File Management Part 2**. An essential follow up to Part 1, skills learned allow you to become in control of your computer and enable you to move on to more advanced courses

**Windows 10** - Two week course for members who have upgraded to or have a new computer with Windows 10. Learn about the new features and become familiar with Windows 10.

**PowerPoint**. This two week course uses Microsoft PowerPoint 2013. You will learn how to create a new presentation consisting of a Title slide and several information slides. Add text boxes and messages to slides, insert photos and examine different ways to view slides.

**MOVING ON:** The following courses are recommended for members who have completed the **Introductory One & Two courses and Part One & Two File Management courses**.

**Computer Maintenance** – two 2-hour sessions – covers the important aspects of keeping your computer running reliably.

**Microsoft Publisher** – two 2-hour sessions – using Microsoft Publisher – covers Newsletters, Brochures, Notices, Calendars, Certificates, Greeting Cards and Letterheads.

**Using the Genealogy Program Legacy** – four 2-hour lessons. Learn how to use the popular family history computer program Legacy Family Tree. Note that Family history research is not part of the course.

**Photoshop Elements 2** – four 2-hour sessions - is an advanced Course in photo editing. Learn how to use many of the tools available in this program to enhance, repair and restore photos.

**Picasa** – four 2-hour sessions. This free photograph viewing and organizing program has easy-to-use basic photo editing functions and a powerful search function. .

**Using Microsoft Excel** - this four lesson Course is for members who have done the Introduction to Excel Workshop or have some experience with Excel. Learn how to set up a spreadsheets etc.

**Introductory Course One is a pre-requisite; Introductory Two and File Management Courses are recommended for some Workshops.**
